- Offers technical assistance and support in early education classrooms for developmentally appropriate curriculum.

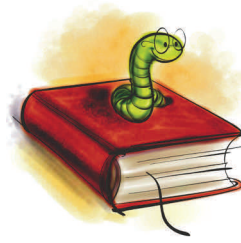


FREE Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK)
