



 This is due to rule promulgation, which may affect the contract.



Kindergarten Registration: Please be sure to contact the school district that your child will attend to register them for kindergarten. Check out the requirements such as physicals and immunizations which may be required.


All VPK registration must be done on the Family Portal @

If you need assistance, staff is available in each of our offices to assist you. Each of the offices is equipped with a kiosk where you can apply online and upload your documents.

The program is free for 4-year-olds who reside in Florida and were born on or before Sept. 1 of the year they would enter the program. Parents of 4-year-olds with birthdays from Feb. 2 through Sept. 1 may postpone enrolling their child until the following year when they are 5.
